The NW Thunder Mentor/Work Experience program is for anyone interested in media:

Positions available are –

1. Live Stream Operator
2. Game Day Commissioner
3. Match Manager.

The Mentor/Work Experience program covers:

1. Game Day Commissioner

- Game day preparation and set up.
- Working with NW Tasmania Thunder game day team.
- Work in conjunction with game day NBL1 commentators.
- Work in conjunction with game day court side commentators/sound desk.
- Work in conjunction with game day score and stats bench.
- Work in conjunction with game Match Manager.
- Work in conjunction with game day NBL1 courtside commentators.
- Collate and send through result sheets (Score and Box Score sheet) to NBL1 head office.
- Understanding the use of the Referees, Instant Review System (IRS).

2. Live Stream Operator

- Communicate with NBL1 media room (in Melbourne).
- Using communication app, Slack support Channel (Slack is a cloud-based team communication platform).
- Using a LiveU Solo (video streaming equipment).
- Using an Audio Mixer.
- Using Canon Video Camera which connects to the Audio Mixer and LiveU Solo video streaming equipment.

3. Match Manager

- Game day preparation and set up.
- Work with the Game Day Commissioner
- Welcoming and assisting visiting teams
- Provide teams with stats sheets
- Undertake Match Manager duties e.g. fill-up drink stations, provide towels, supply and use blood kits when needed, generally look after teams during the game.
- Pack up benches after games
- Hand final box score sheets to teams at the end of the games.
